- 3. Approval of minutes for meeting 1st May 2023. Approved

4. Reports:

- 4.1 Finances. Current bank balance £4875.97. In this period we have received total income of £1367.41 (£900 donation received from Rock Solid and £424.84 Fife Council grant). Expenditure was £1898.31(£1649 was ebikes). It was noted that that we are currently underspending by £1660 according to the plans put in place at the start of the financial year. Mostly this was due to £600 delayed decision on Autospeedwatch system, revised decision on Cairn and less money planters. The committee continue to welcome ideas for how we can invest back into the community
- 4.1.1 Electronic banking partially in place. Can now view statements etc online, but electronic funds transfer is still not possible
- 4.1.2 Proposal for PWG to spend £300 on paths signage. Approved. Note: we anticipate that this money will be refunded by Lairds upon production of receipts.
- 4.1.3 Request funds for e-bike mirrors £10. Approved by increased to £20
- 4.1.4 Request funds for e-bike protective covers £20. Approved.
- 4.2 Paths Working Group. Signposts and stiles to be purchased. Way marker circles are to state Giffordtown & District with a direction arrow. Quarry diversion path now open from Coffin Road to Burnside. Extension path round to Kilwhiss/BackHouse road has been cut back and is now accessible. Ongoing maintenance being carried out on Coffin Road all the way to Kinloch entrance **A. Christie.**
- 4.3 Speed reduction/speed awareness. Awaiting confirmation of meeting with Senior Police officers to discuss the continuing speeding issues. Will deploy Speedwatch teams where possible. **D. Ellison.**
- 4.4 Road matters. Blocked gullies next to Woodside House and flooding under bridge leading to recycling centre being investigated by Fife Council teams. **Secretary.**
