January 2022 Howe of Fife & Taycoast Community Council Report

Introduction

Community Officers PCs Lowe and Haddow along with assistance from Response officers have been targeting speeding motorists and antisocial behaviour this month. We've been listening to residents' concerns and trying to prioritise these areas that are highlighted. Road Policing have also been out in our area as well providing visibility and assistance as we aim to keep our communities safer. As restrictions ease school and community visits can start again with some already in the diary.

Calls Received (up to end of January2022)

Since 1st January 2022, Police have received 165 calls in the Howe of Fife and Taycoast area resulting in 20 crimes being recorded. This breaks down as follows:

Auchtermuchty

21 calls to the police consisting of Concern for Persons, Assist member of the Public, Fraud, Abandoned 999 call, Theft, Assault and Road Traffic Incident.

2 recorded crimes – 1 x Theft, 1 x Assault

Strathmiglo

0 recorded crimes.


Abdie & Dunbog (Abdie, Dunbog, Lindores, Grange of Lindores, Den of Lindores)

This month PC's Haddow and Lowe have been concentrating on Operation Paramount - driver behaviour - in various hotspots identified as areas for speeding motorists Gateside, Giffordtown/Charlottetown and Ladybank.



Pop up Bob has also been deployed in Gateside, Ladybank, Charlottetown, Strathmiglo and Bow of Fife in an effort to assist with traffic calming measures.





Community Engagement

We have attended and spoken with some residents of Gateside regarding ongoing issues they are experiencing with speeding traffic travelling through the village following which we have spoken with Fife Camera Safety Partnership to request that consideration be given to them attending the area and carrying out a speed check site in an effort to alleviate some of the problems.

Visits have been arranged with Falkland Primary School and Falkland House to engage with the children and provide inputs on Community Policing and what is involved in this role.

We are aware that a number of Community Council Meetings are still being carried out remotely via Zoom due to Covid-19 restrictions however now that restrictions are easing we will endeavour to attend as many meetings in person when they are back up and running.
