WILDLIFE OFFICER UPDATE

While enjoying walks in the countryside PC Pacholek would ask people to keep their dogs under control at all times. During the winter months hibernating hedgehogs can be particularly vulnerable to disturbance from inquisitive dogs. If you do accidentally disturb a hedgehog nest, cover it back over with a thick layer of leaves and if possible leave some dog food and water nearby so if the hedgehog does wake up they can easily find something to eat before going to find a new hibernation spot and rebuilding their nest.

Birnie and Gaddon Lochs recently had an upsetting incident where a Mute swan which had been seen with fishing tackle trailing from its body was found dead. Birnie and Gaddon Lochs are a Nature Reserve where fishing is not permitted and anyone doing so is committing a criminal offence. I would ask anyone who observes any fishing taking place at the lochs to please phone the police using 101.
