Welcome to August's Howe of Fife Community Council Report from your local officers, PC Mark Lowe and PC Kirstie Haddow.

Officers are continuing their appeal for members of the community to participate in the Community Speed Watch Campaign.

We understand that speeding vehicles in your area is a high priority and an obvious concern. To assist us in combatting this very important issue we would appreciate any willing volunteers for this campaign.

Community Speed Watch involves local resident volunteers being deployed on our roads with speed detection devices to provide a visible presence to deter and identify speeding motorists in hot spot areas.

Any willing volunteers will be vetted and receive full training from your local community officers on using the Speed Detection Device and Conflict Management prior to deployment.

We currently have six willing volunteers going through the vetting process and are desperately seeking others to join them.

Upcoming Events

During the month of September, Officers will be deployed alongside Safer Communities and Fife Countryside Trust carrying out joint patrols across the North East Fife ward area checking various wild camping sites engaging with any campers, educating and providing advice on wild camping etiquette and how to stay safe.

What's Been Happening

During the month of August, PC's Haddow and Lowe were deployed with other officers to participate in policing the St Andrew's Lammas Fair which is believed to be the oldest street fair in Scotland.

PC's Lowe and Haddow have also been in attendance at the Freuchie Cub Cycle, meeting with local leader Catriona Nimmo and the young cubs assisting in part of the process to earn a cycling badge.

Officers spoke with the young cubs offering safety advice prior to setting off on a bicycle trip around the Freuchie area accompanied by some parents.
